**Ontario Association of Agriculture Societies
ANNUAL HAND QUILTED CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT
COMPETITION**

Eligibility, Rules and Regulations

- A. Entries must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agriculture Societies (OAAS) to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Entry quilts must be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter (smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next levels of competition.)
- C. The winner's name and pattern, to be displayed at the Fair, on sign provided by OAAS.
- D. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- E. Upon making an entry into the Ontario Association of Agriculture Societies Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- F. The winning Ontario Association of Agriculture Societies Champion Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention OAAS competition.
- G. The Champion Quilt will be picked from classes 1, 2, 3, 4, listed below.

2. Quilt, reversible, suitable for bedspread, no centre seam
3. Quilt, cotton pieced

**Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies
ANNUAL MACHINE-QUILTED
QUILT/WALL HANGING COMPETITION**

Eligibility, Rules and Regulations

- A. Quilt/Wall Hanging must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agriculture Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Quilt/Wall Hanging to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be minimum 192 inches or 480 cm. Note the article can be square, rectangular etc.
- C. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Machine Quilted Quilt/Wall Hanging will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- D. Upon making entry into the OAAS Machine Quilting competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- E. The winning OAAS Champion Machine Quilted Quilt/Wall Hanging will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Provincial Competition.
- F. The winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- G. Quilt/Wall Hanging must have visible machine quilting.
- H. Champion will be picked from classes 14, 15, listed below.

QUILTS, Machine Quilted 1st-\$10, 2nd-\$7, 3rd-\$5

15. Wall Hanging, machine quilted, total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 192 inches or 480 cm.
